As We Gather...

Welcome to **Good Shepherd** Lutheran Church! It's a privilege and honor to worship our Crucified, Risen, Ascended & Glorified Good Shepherd, Jesus, with you today! We're all glad to have **you** here! As always, make yourself at home, you are among family!

The power of evil is indeed frightening. Who among us is comfortable facing the demons of darkness? Those who stand in Christ, however, stand in His power and might. What causes us fear cannot overcome the Lord. Like the disciples of old, we want to know why it is so hard for us. Like the disciples of old, our Lord reminds us that it is a matter of faith. Our confidence does not lie in our power and strength but in the Lord. In Him we trust; He is our courage and He is our victory. Like the father in today's Gospel lesson, we stand before Jesus both confessing our faith and praying our Lord to help our unbelief that we may be strong and immovable in Christ.

Service Notes...

In preparation for worship: Please take some time to greet the people you are worshiping with! The order of worship for today is *Divine Service Setting Three* beginning on **page 184** in the Lutheran Service Book (*LSB*). An outline of the service and the additional Psalm & Scriptures are printed for you below. Please take a few minutes to familiarize yourself with the order of worship before we begin. You may also want to mark the additional songs: **726**, **849**, **819**, **554**, **846** & **918** in the *LSB*. **Reminder:** If you have a smart phone, and you're on Facebook, please "check in" at *Good Shepherd* Lutheran Church...then turn the sound off! May our Good and Gracious Shepherd bless your worship this day...this NEW day of salvation!

To Stand or Sit: There are certain parts of the service where you will be invited to stand. Sometimes, "wrestling" with kids, or a personal health condition makes standing uncomfortable... please know: It is okay to either stand or sit. Both are appropriate! So please, make yourself comfortable, receive the gifts God loves to give and **BOLDLY** sing His praises!

Children: We are blessed to have a lot of young families and young children here at **Good Shepherd**. We take Jesus' words very seriously when He says, "Let the little children come to me..." We also know how difficult it can be to keep children sitting quietly for any period of time, much less an hour long church service! For your convenience, "Quiet Bags" have been provided for young worshippers. They are located in the narthex to your right (on the "Noah's Ark" wall mounting, next to the big bulletin board) when exiting the sanctuary. Also, for your convenience, a "Crying Room" is located at the back of the sanctuary for use during those "difficult" times. Also, please keep in mind that everyone here loves to have the children here and will help you in any way they can! Please note: Non-communion services may have a children's message which could be recorded via Facebook live. If you have any issues with your child being seen at church on the World Wide Web just listen from the pew!

Guests, Visitors & The Offering: If you are our guest today, you are not expected to contribute monetarily to God's work at Good Shepherd ... you are our guest! Please take this service as our gift to you! If you choose to give an offering, know this: The gifts we give back to God are used by His church to transform lives. (The offering plate is located at the sanctuary entrance)

The Lord's Supper: (Thursday & Sunday at 8:00 am) Good Shepherd joyfully celebrates the Lord's Supper, and we do that in the confession and glad confidence that, as He says, our Lord gives into our mouths not only bread and wine but His very body and blood to eat and drink for the forgiveness of sins and to strengthen our union with Him and with one another Matthew 26:26-28; Mark 14:22-24; Luke 22:19-20; 1 Corinthians 11:23-25. Our Lord invites to His table those who trust His words, repent of all sin, and set aside any refusal to forgive and love as He forgives and loves us, that they may show forth His death until He comes Matthew 5:23; 18:15-35. Because those who eat and drink our Lord's body and blood unworthily do so to their great harm 1 Corinthians 11:27-29 and because Holy Communion is a confession of the faith which is confessed at this altar, any who are not yet instructed, in doubt, or who hold a confession Matthew 10:32 differing from that of this congregation and the Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod, and yet desire to receive the sacrament, are asked first to speak with the pastor. Because Scripture says we ought to "examine ourselves" before receiving the Holy Meal 1 Corinthians 11:28, it is recommended that we review the "Christian Questions with Their Answers" section of the LSB before communion (*page 329 of the LSB*), please take a few moments before the service or during the offering to do so. Thank you! Please note: There are two or three cups at the center of each tray that are non-alcoholic wine for those who prefer such for personal or medical reasons (The wine containing alcohol is white, the nonalcohol is red/pink).

The Old Testament Reading: Isaiah 50:4-10 (The Lord has given me ears to hear and a voice to speak.)

The Sovereign LORD has given me an instructed tongue, to know the word that sustains the weary. He wakens me morning by morning, wakens my ear to listen like one being taught. ⁵ The Sovereign LORD has opened my ears, and I have not been rebellious; I have not drawn back. ⁶ I offered my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who pulled out my beard; I did not hide my face from mocking and spitting. ⁷ Because the Sovereign LORD helps me, I will not be disgraced. Therefore have I set my face like flint, and I know I will not be put to shame. ⁸ He who vindicates me is near. Who then will bring charges against me? Let us face each other! Who is my accuser? Let him confront me! ⁹ It is the Sovereign LORD who helps me. Who is he that will condemn me? They will all wear out like a garment; the moths will eat them up. ¹⁰ Who among you fears the LORD and obeys the word of his servant? Let him who walks in the dark, who has no light, trust in the name of the LORD and rely on his God...This is the Word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God!

From Psalm 116:1–9

Pastor: Gracious is the LORD, and righteous; our God is merciful.

Men: I love the LORD, because He has heard my voice and my pleas for mercy.

Women: Because He inclined His ear to me, therefore I will call on Him as long as I live.

<u>Men:</u> The snares of death encompassed me; the pangs of Sheol laid hold on me; I suffered distress and anguish.

Women: Then I called on the name of the LORD: "O LORD, I pray, deliver my soul!"

Men: Gracious is the LORD, and righteous; our God is merciful.

Women: The LORD preserves the simple; when I was brought low, He saved me.

Men: Return, O my soul, to your rest; for the LORD has dealt bountifully with you.

<u>Women:</u> For You have delivered my soul from death, my eyes from tears, my feet from stumbling;

Men: I will walk before the LORD in the land of the living.

Pastor: Gracious is the LORD, and righteous; our God is merciful.

The Second Reading: James 3:1-12 (The tongue is a fire, a world of unrighteousness.)

Not many of you should presume to be teachers, my brothers, because you know that we who teach will be judged more strictly. ² We all stumble in many ways. If anyone is never at fault in what he says, he is a perfect man, able to keep his whole body in check. ³ When we put bits into the mouths of horses to make them obey us, we can turn the whole animal. ⁴ Or take ships as an example. Although they are so large and are driven by strong winds, they are steered by a very small rudder wherever the pilot wants to go. ⁵ Likewise the tongue is a small part of the body, but it makes great boasts. Consider what a great forest is set on fire by a small spark. ⁶ The tongue also is a fire, a world of evil among the parts of the body. It corrupts the whole person, sets the whole course of his life on fire, and is itself set on fire by hell. ⁷ All kinds of animals, birds, reptiles and creatures of the sea are being tamed and have been tamed by man, ⁸ but no man can tame the tongue. It is a restless evil, full of deadly poison. ⁹ With the tongue we praise our Lord and Father, and with it we curse men, who have been made in God's likeness. ¹⁰ Out of the same mouth come praise and cursing. My brothers, this should not be.¹¹ Can both fresh water and salt^a water flow from the same spring? ¹² My brothers, can a fig tree bear olives, or a grapevine bear figs? Neither can a salt spring produce fresh water....This is the Word of the Lord.

All: Thanks be to God!

We Stand and Sing our Alleluias... (pg. 190 middle)

The Gospel Reading: Mark 9:14-29 (Jesus releases a youth from a demon that he might speak again.)

Pastor: The Holy Gospel according to St. Mark, the ninth chapter. All: (*sung; pg. 157 middle*) *Glory be to Thee, O Lord.*

When they came to the other disciples, they saw a large crowd around them and the teachers of the law arguing with them. ¹⁵ As soon as all the people saw Jesus, they were overwhelmed with wonder and ran to greet him. ¹⁶ "What are you arguing with them about?" he asked. ¹⁷ A man in the crowd answered, "Teacher, I brought you my son, who is possessed by a spirit that has robbed him of speech. ¹⁸ Whenever it seizes him, it throws him to the ground. He foams at the mouth, gnashes his teeth and becomes rigid. I asked your disciples to drive out the spirit, but they could not." ¹⁹ "O unbelieving generation," Jesus replied, "how long shall I stay with you? How long shall I put up with you? Bring the boy to me." ²⁰ So they brought him. When the spirit saw Jesus, it immediately threw the boy into a convulsion. He fell to the ground and rolled around, foaming at the mouth. ²¹ Jesus asked the boy's father, "How long has he been like this?" "From childhood," he answered. 22 "It has often thrown him into fire or water to kill him. But if you can do anything, take pity on us and help us." ²³ "If you can'?" said Jesus. "Everything is possible for him who believes." ²⁴ Immediately the boy's father exclaimed, "I do believe; help me overcome my unbelief!"²⁵ When Jesus saw that a crowd was running to the scene, he rebuked the evila spirit. "You deaf and mute spirit," he said, "I command you, come out of him and never enter him again." ²⁶ The spirit shrieked, convulsed him violently and came out. The boy looked so much like a corpse that many said, "He's dead." ²⁷ But Jesus took him by the hand and lifted him to his feet, and he stood up.²⁸ After Jesus had gone indoors, his disciples asked him privately, "Why couldn't we drive it out?"²⁹ He replied, "This kind can come out only by prayer.^b"...This is the Gospel of the Lord.
